

# Study Abroad in DUBLIN, IRFLAND

## June 3-16, 2018 University College Dublin 6 credit hours (H,I/H)

(Enrollment is very limited)

Northern Oklahoma College is partnering with University College Dublin, Ireland's oldest and most renowned university to offer the 2018 DUBLIN SUMMER PROGRAM, June 3-16, 2018. Students will attend courses and participate in educational and cultural faculty-led and independent field programs while being a part of an Irish and international university community in one of the most beautiful cities in the world.

**COURSES:** Each student is required to take the two classes during the program for a total of six credit hours.

**GLBL 2113: Global Studies in Humanities (H, I) – W. Watkins** This course will explore a Ireland's rich and diverse cultural aspects. Students will examine cultural fields such as: literature, music, visual and performing arts, sports, anthropology, religion, language, history, politics and philosophy. (Meets requirement for humanities credit and International Dimension)

**ENGL 2413: Introduction to Creative Writing (H) – D. Watkins** This course includes the study and practice of creative writing as it pertains to poetry, fiction and creative nonfiction, both from a critical and personal perspective. (Meets requirements for humanities credit.)

There will be a required pre-departure reading packet for both courses.

**HOUSING & MEALS:** Students stay in UCD dormitories in en suite single rooms. The residence hall reception desk is staffed 24 hours a day. Students will have access to: laundry facility, college library, computer lab, common kitchen, student center, gym, WiFi, and swimming pool. All students will receive approximately \$15/per day meal allowance which can be used to purchase meals in the various campus catering facilities.

FEEs \$2,700 (airfare not included). A non-refundable deposit of \$800 will be due upon enrollment. A second payment of ~\$1,020 will be charged on Spring 2018 semester NOC account and payable on or before March 2018. A final payment of approximately \$880 will be due in May 2018 (out-of-state fee is additional). The cost includes: tuition, fees, housing, orientation tour, some local transport, out-of-town tours, travel/medical insurance, required course activities and partial meal plan (~2 meals per day). Students will need money for: passport, airfare, local independent travel, shopping, snacks, meals away from campus, independent tours/travel, etc.

**DEADLINE:** The last day to enroll will be May 1, 2018; however, due to limited space available, we anticipate space to fill up well before the deadline. If a student enrolls after January 5<sup>th</sup> 2018, both the deposit and second payment will be due on spring 2018 NOC account.
