



Study Abroad in London, England

Northern Oklahoma College is once again offering one of our most popular study abroad experiences – The London Summer Program. Students will attend courses, participate in academic and cultural field trips, and enjoy guest lecturers in the most cosmopolitan city in the world.

COURSES: Each student is required to take two classes during the program for a total of six semester credit hours.

GLBL 2123: Global Culture and Society (H, I) - Dean W. Watkins This course will explore a specific country or region's cultural fields. Students may examine cultural fields such as: literature, music, visual and performing arts, sports, anthropology, religion, language, history, politics and philosophy. (Meets requirement for humanities credit and International Dimension)

HUMN 2103: Introduction to American Studies (D, H) – Prof J. Cook Interdisciplinary study of American civilization through case studies of American cultural groups and global perceptions in order to understand the multiple roles of world culture in American life. It will also investigate concepts of American cultural diffusion including: Americanization, sports, entertainment, and politics from a global perspective. (Meets requirement for humanities credit and OSU Diversity dimension)

Class and independent visits to local sites will be required to complete course requirements. There will be a required pre-departure reading packet for both courses.

HOUSING & MEALS: Students are housed on the campus of Regents University in same-gender double or triple rooms. The reception desk is staffed 24 hours a day and a Resident Assistant lives on each floor. Students will have access to: laundry facility, college library, computer lab, student center, and tennis courts. All students will receive £10/per day on their Regent's University ID card they can use to purchase meals in the refectory (cafeteria).

COSTS: \$2,700 (*airfare is not included*). A non-refundable deposit of \$700 is due upon enrollment. A second payment of ~\$1,120 will be charged on Spring 2018 semester NOC account and payable on or before March 2018. A final payment of approximately \$880 will be due in May 2018 (out-of-state fee is additional). The cost includes: tuition, fees, housing, books, orientation tour, some local transport, theater performance, travel/medical insurance, required activities and partial meal plan (~2 meals per day). Students will need money for: passport, airfare, local independent travel, shopping, snacks, meals away from campus, independent tours/travel, etc.

DEADLINE: This program will sell out so it's best to enroll early. If a student enrolls after Jan 5th 2018 both the \$700 deposit and second payment will be payable on spring semester account.
