**Continue to assess factors impacting student success in the program and implement actions to improve the completion rate while still maintaining an adequate NCLEX pass rate. Data from the Student Assessment and Counseling (SOS) policy is being evaluated. Changes to SOS policy are ongoing in response to analysis of data. Retention rate on all three campuses improved during this academic year.**

The completion rate for all campuses remained above our benchmark of 73%.

Faculty reviewed different pre-admission examinations from NLNPAX and HESI presentations at our annual spring faculty retreat. The faculty will discuss pros and cons and select the pre-admission examination that we will implement for the 2014-2015 academic year. We currently utilize the ACT exam as a requirement for our nursing program. The faculty decided that a pre-admission exam specifically for nursing students may be a better option for our program.

We have had an ATI integration specialist educate faculty about ATI so we can better utilize ATI.

We are also reviewing Kaplan NCLEX review and may choose to utilize Kaplan instead of ATI. We can then compare pass rates.
